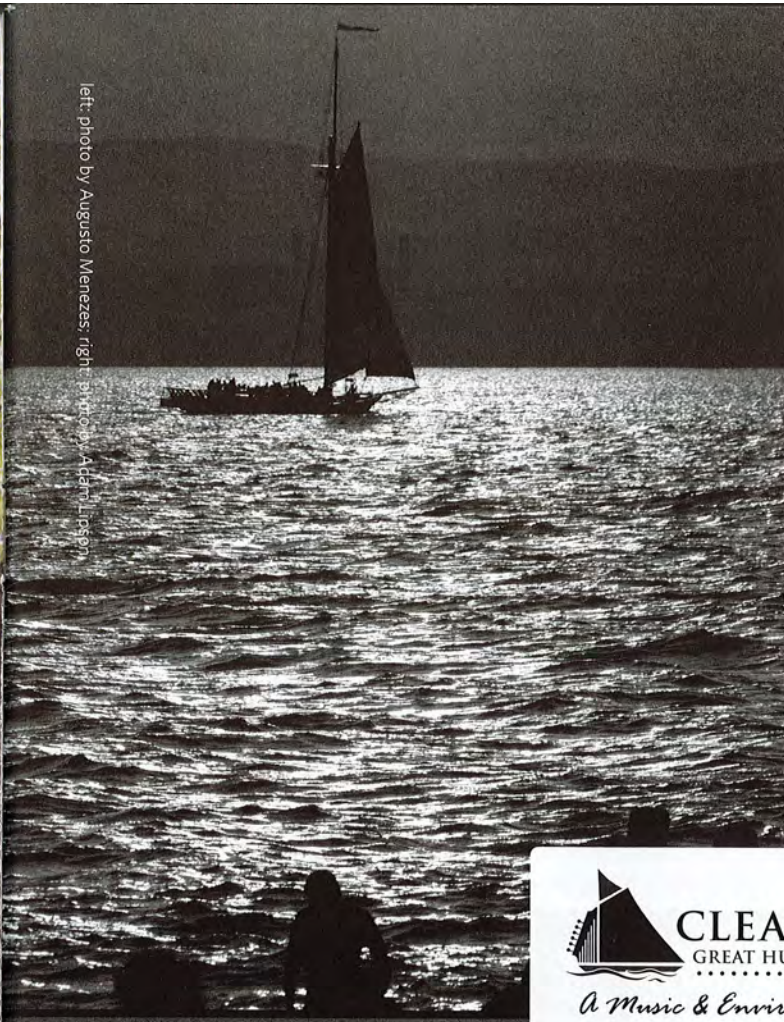

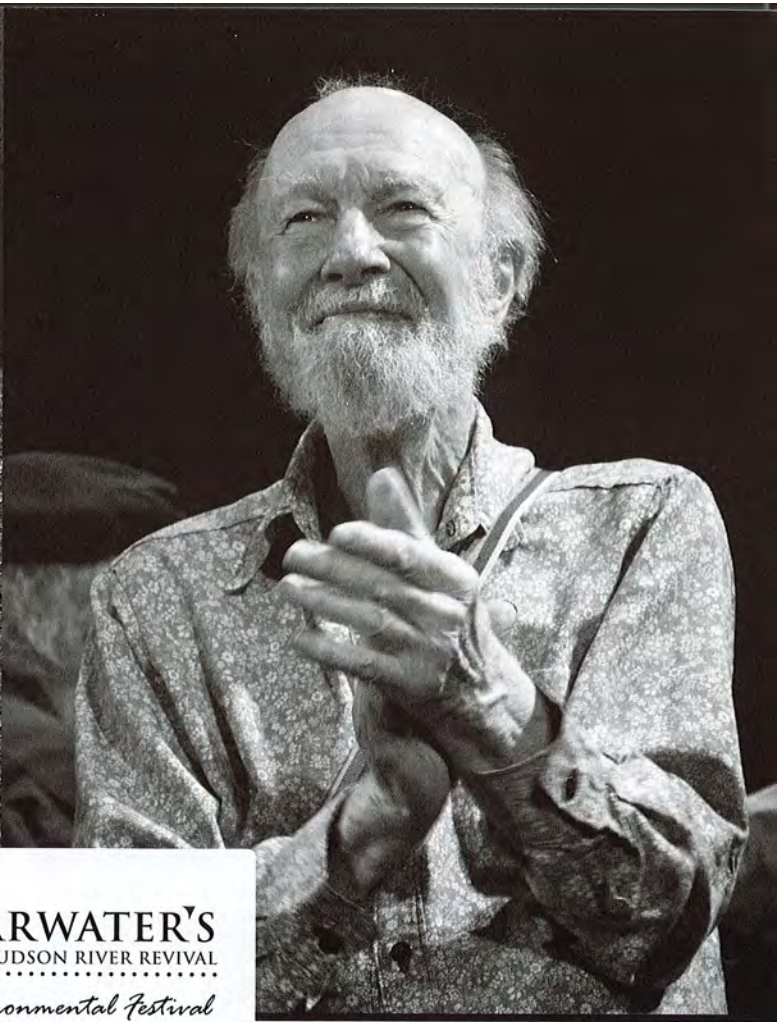

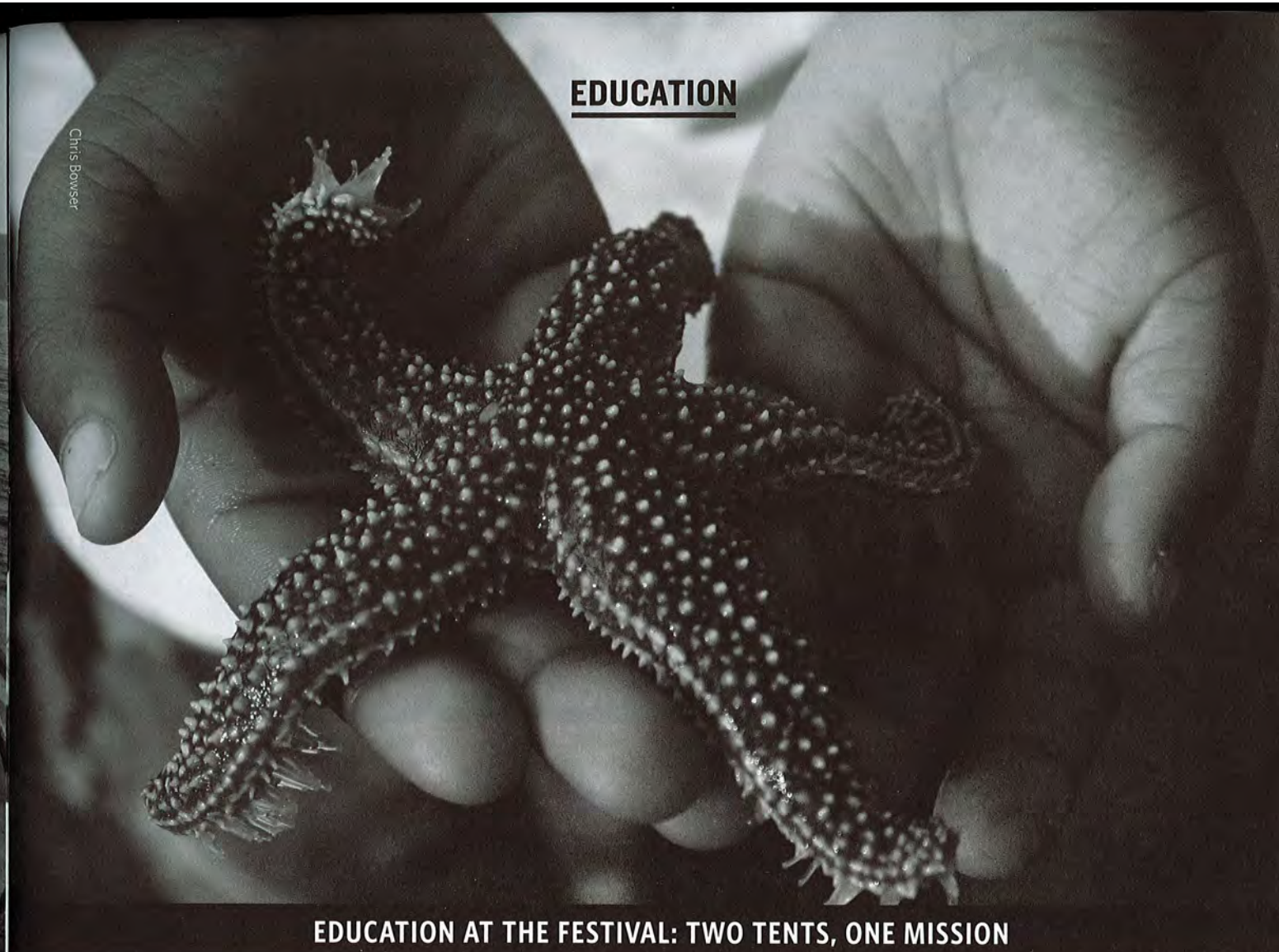

EDUCATION AT THE FESTIVAL: TWO TENTS, ONE MISSION

Year after year, Clearwater's growing family of volunteers bring hard work, new ideas, positive energy, and boundless enthusiasm to the Clearwater legacy. In the 1960s, volunteers "passed the hat" and raised money to build the sloop *Clearwater* at Hudson Valley Folk Picnics. Four decades later, the folk picnic has evolved into a tradition of active, ongoing volunteer participation.

The sloop *Clearwater* in all her glory is one part of Clearwater's legacy. Thousands of volunteers helped raise the money to build the boat and thousands more contribute time, energy, resources, and skills to keep her on the water every year. Each returning volunteer and every new member of our community is welcome to lend a hand!

One of the things that separates the Clearwater Festival from other music venues is the hands-on education components, specifically Hudson River education. Since the festival is located right on the river, it seems fitting to show everyone some of what makes the Hudson a special place.

We do this primarily at two locations: the **Discovery Tent** and the **Tideline Tent**. Upon entering these tents, festivalgoers are treated to a variety of exhibits and activities that illustrate why the Hudson is considered one of the most amazing river systems in the world. In the Discovery Tent, located on the main pathway across from the Family Stage, you will encounter creatures of the fresh and brackish water of the Hudson as well as fish and crabs from Long Island Sound in our large aquaria. Pet the unofficial mascot of the *Clearwater*, a "hogchoker," a small flatfish that is found throughout the estuary. Maybe you'll find a horseshoe crab or sea star. You'll have the chance to identify "macroinvertebrates," small creatures that are key indicators of stream health. Also on hand will be a demonstration of rain barrels and how green infrastructure in the city can help keep rivers clean, part of Clearwater's

Green Cities Initiative. There's a scale model of the sloop *Clearwater* and a giant model of the Hudson watershed as well.

Make sure to come down to the Working Waterfront and visit the Tideline Tent. Here you'll discover the world of the American eel, a strange and misunderstood fish that begins its life in the faraway Sargasso Sea, spending most of its time in the Hudson only to return to the ocean to spawn. You'll also learn about Camp Clearwater, our summer excursion program for young teens that involves kayaking and canoeing for weeks at a time on the Hudson River. Each day, join us for a watercolor painting workshop given by our artist/educators, Bryan and Susan Perrin.

On Saturday and Sunday at 1pm, we will head to the swim beach and see what we can catch with our beach seine. The Tideline Tent is also the site of our "Science Lounge," a small seminar area

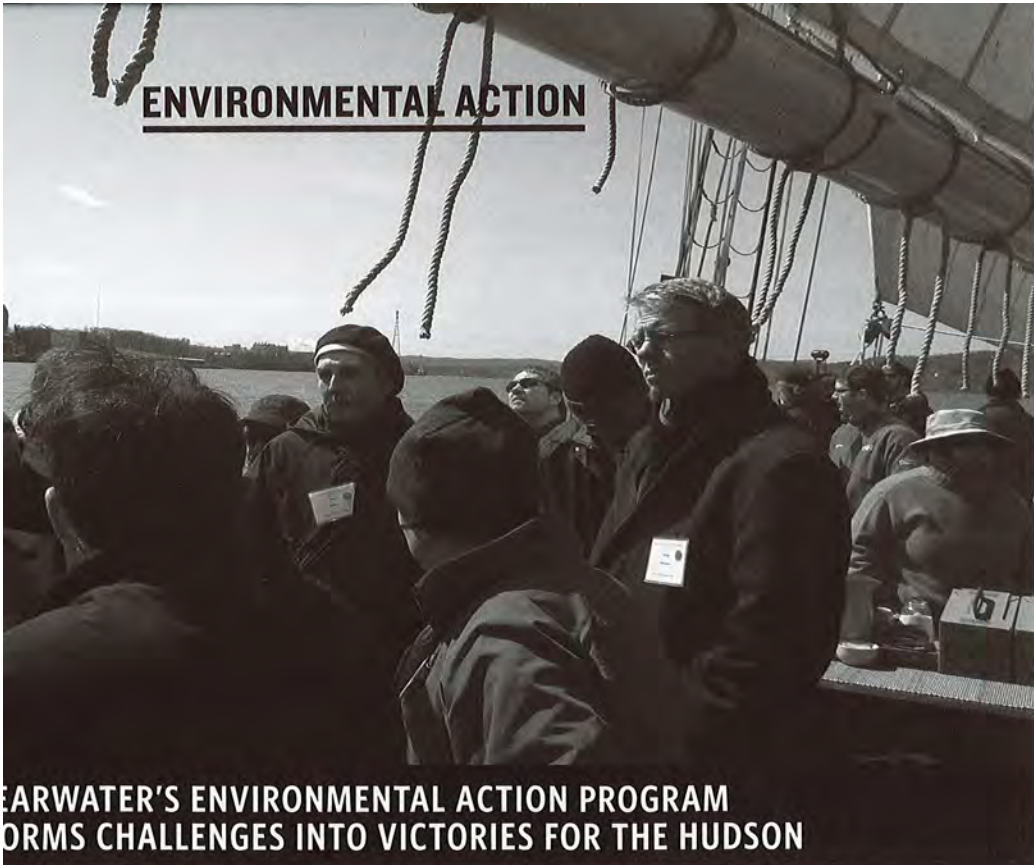
where folks can learn about current research on the Hudson River. Our Hudson River education partners will also be on-hand with interactive exhibits and displays.

Clearwater education is all about getting kids involved with the river, seeing their connection to it, and starting them on the path to be the next generation of environmental leaders. Our "pipeline" of programs offers a variety of entry points for students to get engaged with the Hudson. Education at the Clearwater festival helps us extend the impact of our core education efforts, including our "Classroom Under Sail" program on board our boats, the sloop *Clearwater* and schooner *Mystic Whaler*. Be sure to stop by the boats sometime during the weekend and say hi to the crew.

Indian Point also uses 2.5 billion gallons a day of river water for its once-through cooling system, which kills billions of fish, larvae, and other organisms a year—an important cause of the steady decline of 10 of the 13 signature Hudson River fish. Clearwater applauds NY State Department of Environmental Conservation's decision to withhold Indian Point's Water Quality Certification (WQC) unless Entergy installs a closed-cycle cooling system, which would reduce the plant's water usage by more than 90%.

The approximately 2,000 megawatts of electricity generated by this aging nuclear power complex can readily be replaced by actively transitioning to a green energy economy, which relies on a combination of solar, wind, tidal, low-impact hydroelectric, other fuel-free, renewable sources, and energy efficiency.

HUDSON RIVER PCB CLEAN-UP RESUMES AFTER A YEAR OF REVIEW

After a year off to review Phase 1, EPA issued revised performance standards for the second phase of the Hudson River PCB remediation, which General Electric resumed in May 2011. Clearwater has

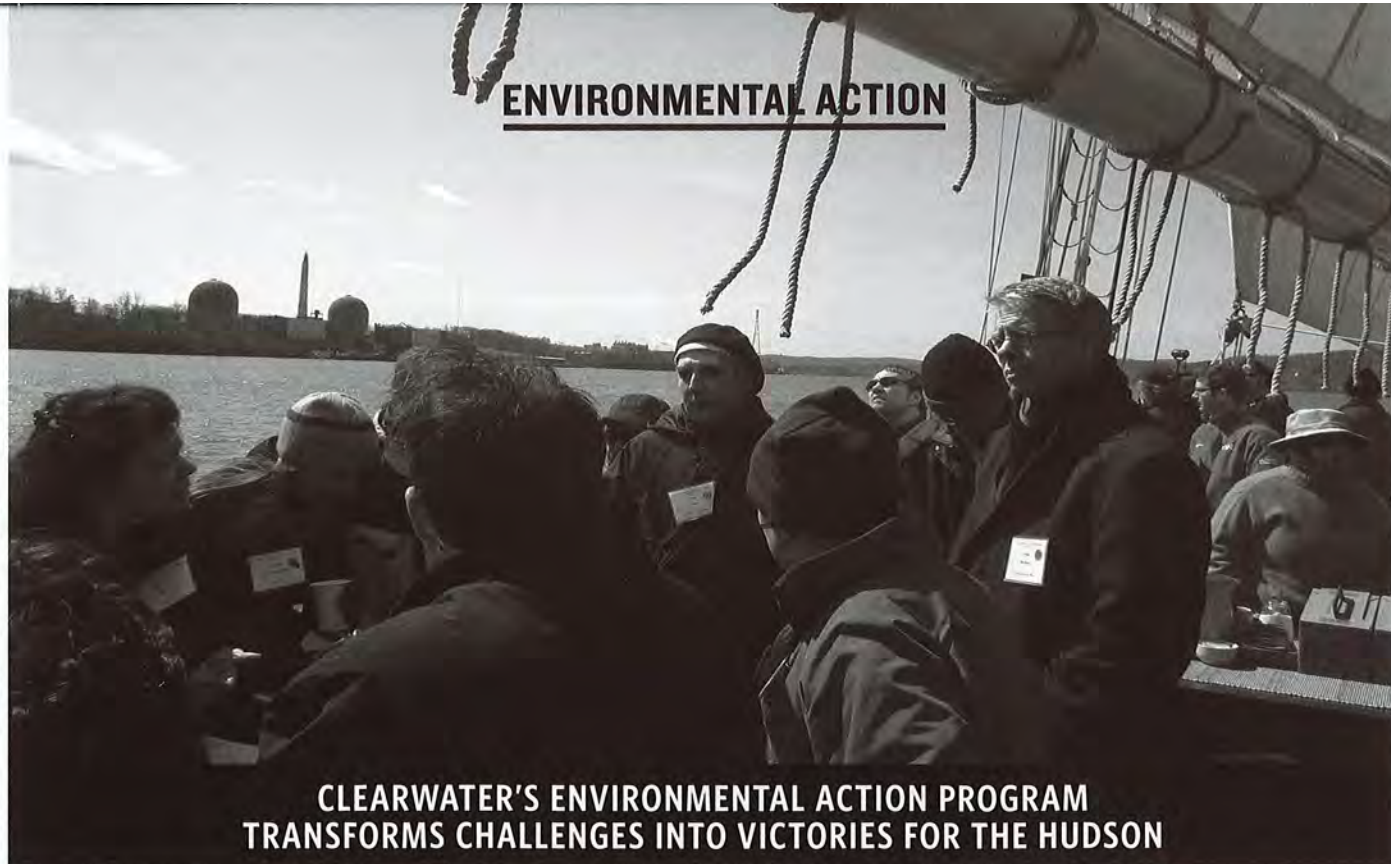

WATERSHED PROTECTION AND GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE PLANNING IN HUDSON RIVER CITIES:

Clearwater has partnered with the Hudson Valley Regional Council and the Hudson River Watershed Alliance to implement a Green Infrastructure (GI) planning project in the Hudson Valley region to support green jobs and local economic revitalization. At least 10 community-based plans for implementing GI techniques are being developed in each of the participating communities. Victor-Pierre Melendez, who has been coordinating watershed planning in the lower, non-tidal Rondout Creek Watershed, will extend his work to Kingston in the tidal Rondout for this project. Our Environmental Justice Associate, Karla Raimundi, works in Peekskill, Beacon, and the Fishkill Watershed, and Ryan Palmer will continue community outreach, watershed organizing and educational efforts in Poughkeepsie and Hyde Park in the Fallkill Watershed. Other participating communities include Yonkers, Pawling, Newburgh, Warwick, and Greenwood Lake. This project is being funded by the American Recovery Reinvestment Act (ARRA) through the NY State Department of Environmental Conservation

CLEARWATER'S ENVIRONMENTAL ACTION PROGRAM TRANSFORMS CHALLENGES INTO VICTORIES FOR THE HUDSON

INDIAN POINT UPDATE

Clearwater was busily preparing for upcoming hearings on the Indian Point relicensing case, when the earthquake and tsunami caused what turned out to be a disaster of epic proportions at the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear facility in Japan. Clearwater's response was to bring together key decision-makers and community leaders for a sail around Indian Point followed by a technical briefing to understand the dangers of the facility poses and the need to rapidly transition away from our dependence on nuclear power and fossil fuel by bringing clean, sustainable energy infrastructure into the Hudson Valley. Issues included:

- potential for seismic activity related to Indian Point's location near the intersection of two active earthquake faults,
- leaks of radioactive isotopes into the groundwater under the plant and into the Hudson River (from which Rockland County may soon be taking drinking water),
- a history of problems including a steam boiler rupture, clogged cooling water intakes, transformer explosions, and siren failures,
- long-term on-site storage of high-level nuclear waste, and impossibility of evacuation by the almost 20 million people that live or work within 50 miles of the plant.

Clearwater recently joined 45 other organizations calling for the suspension of licensing and relicensing of nuclear power plants across the country until lessons from Fukushima can be integrated into the regulations that govern this process.

HUDSON RIVER PCB CLEAN-UP RESUMES AFTER A YEAR OF REVIEW

After a year off to review Phase 1, EPA issued revised performance standards for the second phase of the Hudson River PCB remediation, which General Electric resumed in May 2011. Clearwater has been awarded a technical assistance grant (TAG) to retain an independent expert and to provide public education for the next three years, while the remaining 35 miles of hot spots are dredged from the Upper Hudson over the next five to seven years. The consultant will check that control measures are effectively minimizing resuspension of contaminated sediment and volatilization of PCBs into the air. Clearwater is also working with the Community Advisory Group (CAG) to urge that navigational

dredging occur simultaneously or sequentially with the environmental dredging required by EPA, to assure that full use of the river by larger recreation boats and shipping vessels is restored. If navigational dredging, which has not been done in the Upper Hudson since the 1980s, is not undertaken while General Electric's dewatering/processing and rail facilities are operating, the NYS Canal Corporation will need to go back later to perform the work needed to deepen the channel—at great expense to New York taxpayers. Honoring its commitment to the river, Clearwater will continue to work to assure that this project results in a world-class clean up, even under occasionally challenging circumstances.

Clearwater was recently awarded an EPA Environmental Justice Small Grant to promote Climate Justice in four Hudson River cities to help reduce their carbon emissions and assure that economically disadvantaged and/or communities of color are not disproportionately impacted by climate change and are adequately prepared to manage its potential consequences.

As an extension of a collaborative project with CEEP in Peekskill, Clearwater is implementing a Climate Justice initiative to assess potential environmental, economic, public health, and safety impacts of climate change on communities of color and low income in Kingston, Poughkeepsie, Beacon, and Peekskill.

Our Environmental Justice Associate, Karla Raimundi, works in Peekskill, Beacon, and the Fishkill Watershed, and Ryan Palmer will continue community outreach, watershed organizing and educational efforts in Poughkeepsie and Hyde Park in the Fallkill Watershed. Other participating communities include Yonkers, Pawling, Newburgh, Warwick, and Greenwood Lake. This project is being funded by the American Recovery Reinvestment Act (ARRA) through the NY State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC).

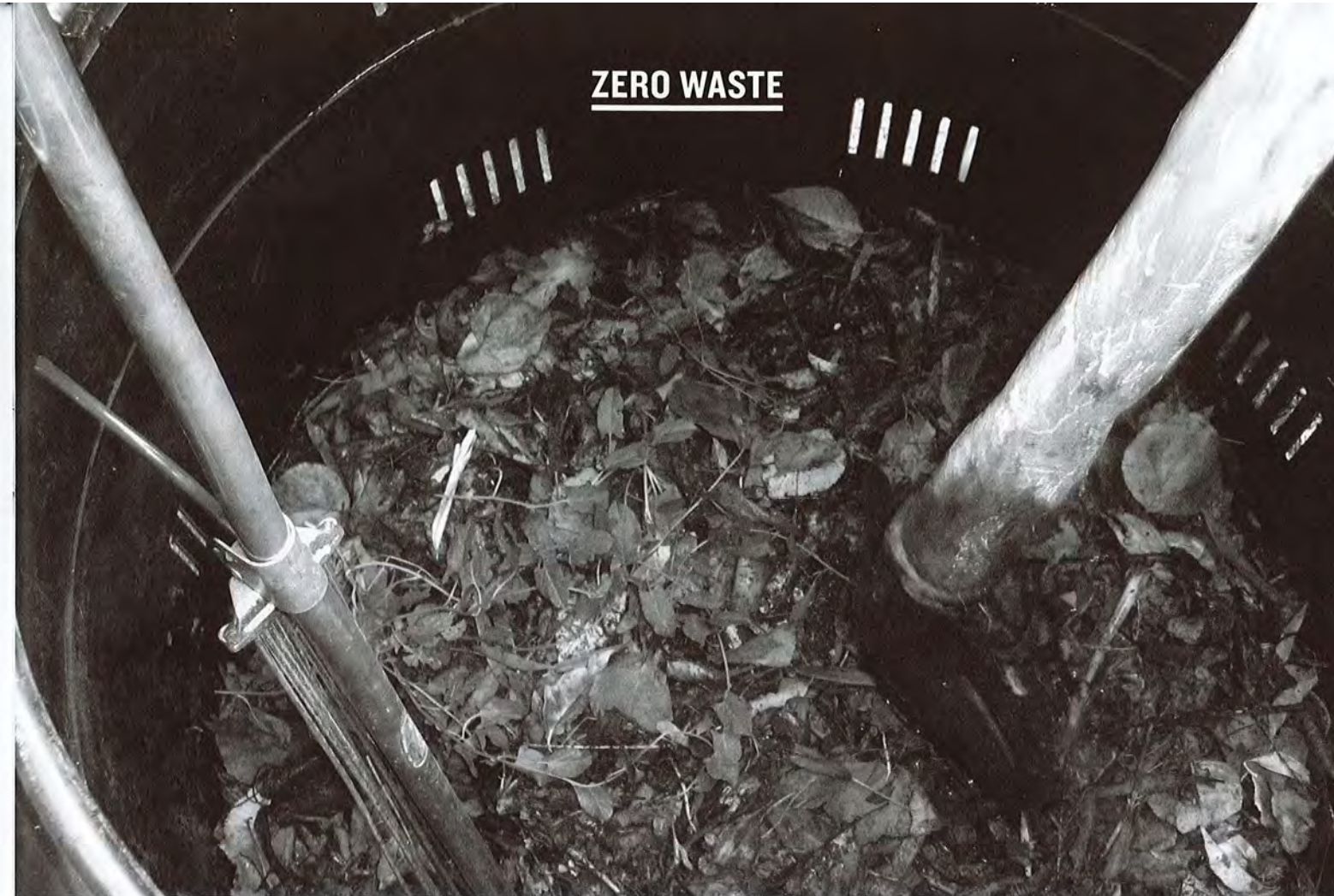

ZERO WASTE

Revival serves thousands of people, including audience, volunteers, staff, and artists. From the very beginning over 40 years ago, our festival has taken responsibility for the waste that we generate. We ask that you help us work towards a goal of zero waste by reusing when possible, and utilizing the sorting stations located around the site. To make it easier, food vendors will be offering products on compostable or recyclable serviceware. If you have questions, please ask the vendor or one of our helpful Zero Waste volunteers! Each sorting station includes three bins:

COMPOST

All food waste (including meat, bones, and dairy)
Paper plates, waxed paper, paper napkins, and chopsticks
Compostable plastics (#7 PLA utensils, cups, and straws)

RECYCLING

- Bottles
- Cans
- Plastics - new for this year, you can recycle all numbered plastics except for...
 - Styrofoam, unmarked plastics and bags still go in the trash bins.
 - Compostable plastics should be composted, not recycled.

TRASH

We ask that you only dispose of true trash. Please double check where the product came from on the festival grounds. If it's from the food court or any food vendor it is compostable or recyclable. The trash bin is the last resort.

ZERO WASTE

Over the past four years, our festival has been moving toward zero waste. This means that every year we have increased the percentage of Festival materials recovered through composting and recycling, thus reducing the amount of trash added to the waste stream and hauled to the county incinerator. We rely on everyone at the festival to chip in by taking an extra moment every



time you throw something away. Together we can make this work.

Remember to **Reduce** the amount you use, use **Reusable** items and, when buying, buy stuff made from **Recycled** materials. Bring your travel mug or water bottle with you to stay hydrated. A spork or reusable silverware are small and can easily tuck away in a pocket when not in use. Be creative and help support our zero waste efforts.

QUESTIONS?

Our festival Zero Waste committee has trained volunteers to help you decide where your waste can be deposited. Please ask them to help you sort compostables and recyclables. They are present at each sorting station in the food court and at various locations around the festival grounds.

We are proud of this year's generations theme. Combining the wisdom of our elders and the energy and enthusiasm of our youth is the only formula that will move us toward environmental sanity and social and political justice. While enjoying all the music of entertainers and their offspring this year, the Activist Area would like to dedicate this year's efforts to the memory of two of our remarkable elders, Art Hamel and Peter Rossi.

As Eldridge Cleaver said, "If you're not part of the solution, you're part of the problem." They were certainly part of the solution. As true advocates for a better world, they spoke out when others spoke from ignorance, fear, and selfishness. We can be thankful for what they gave us and for the role models they were. We embrace the generations theme with our youth so that the efforts and dedication of these men can influence future generations. They had the same spiritual consciousness that Pete Seeger has and we must do whatever we can to insure that our youth embrace it.

Special note: The main issue at hand is that if there is going to be any sane and positive changes in our world, it will happen if every conscientious citizen gets actively involved. "When I see people suffering or a problem affecting others, I cannot sit still. I need to take action." (Jun-san, the Buddhist nun running the Grafton Peace Pagoda.) There are many ways that people can be part of the solution. Two examples in this year's Activist Area will be the presence of Westchester's Raging Grannies and a two-day fast and chanting by Jun-san and members of the Grafton Peace Pagoda for the end of nuclear power in our country, especially Indian Point. Please come and visit us.

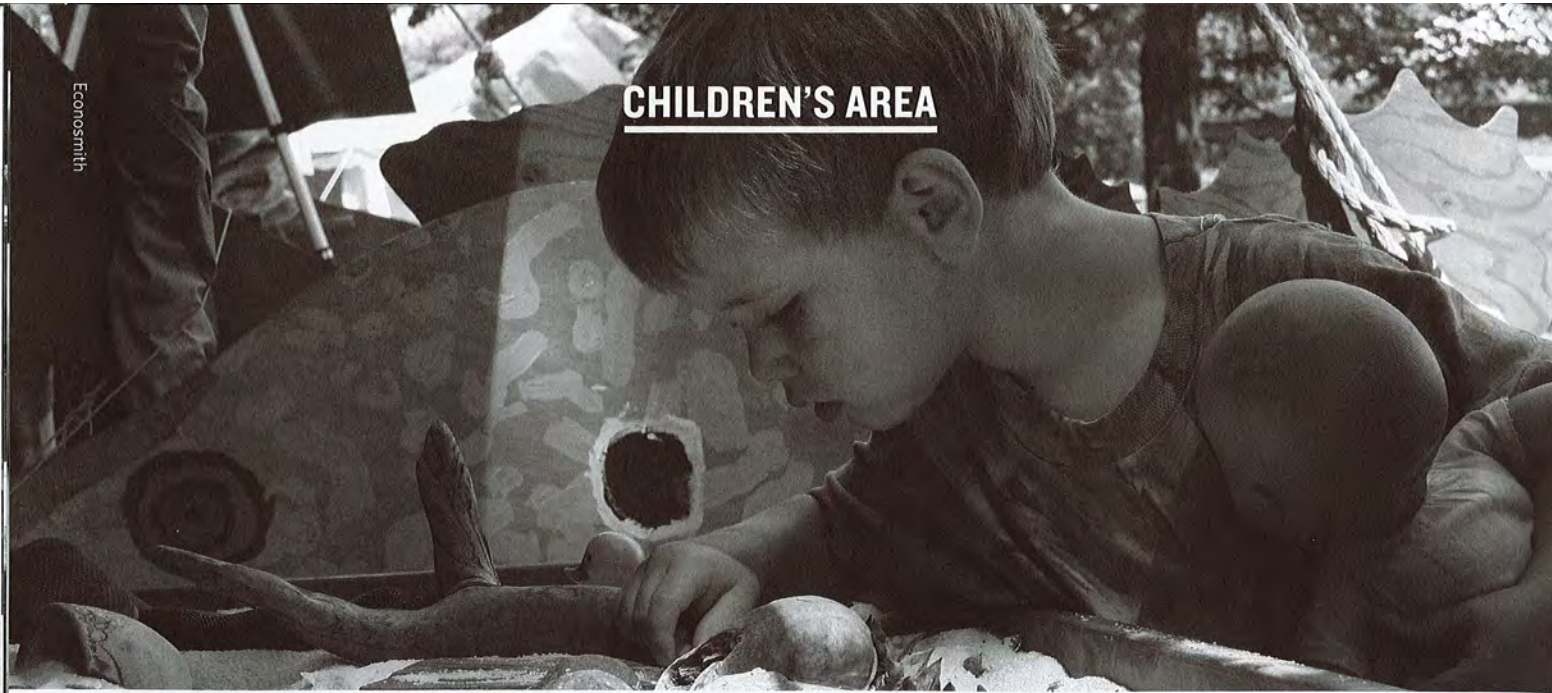

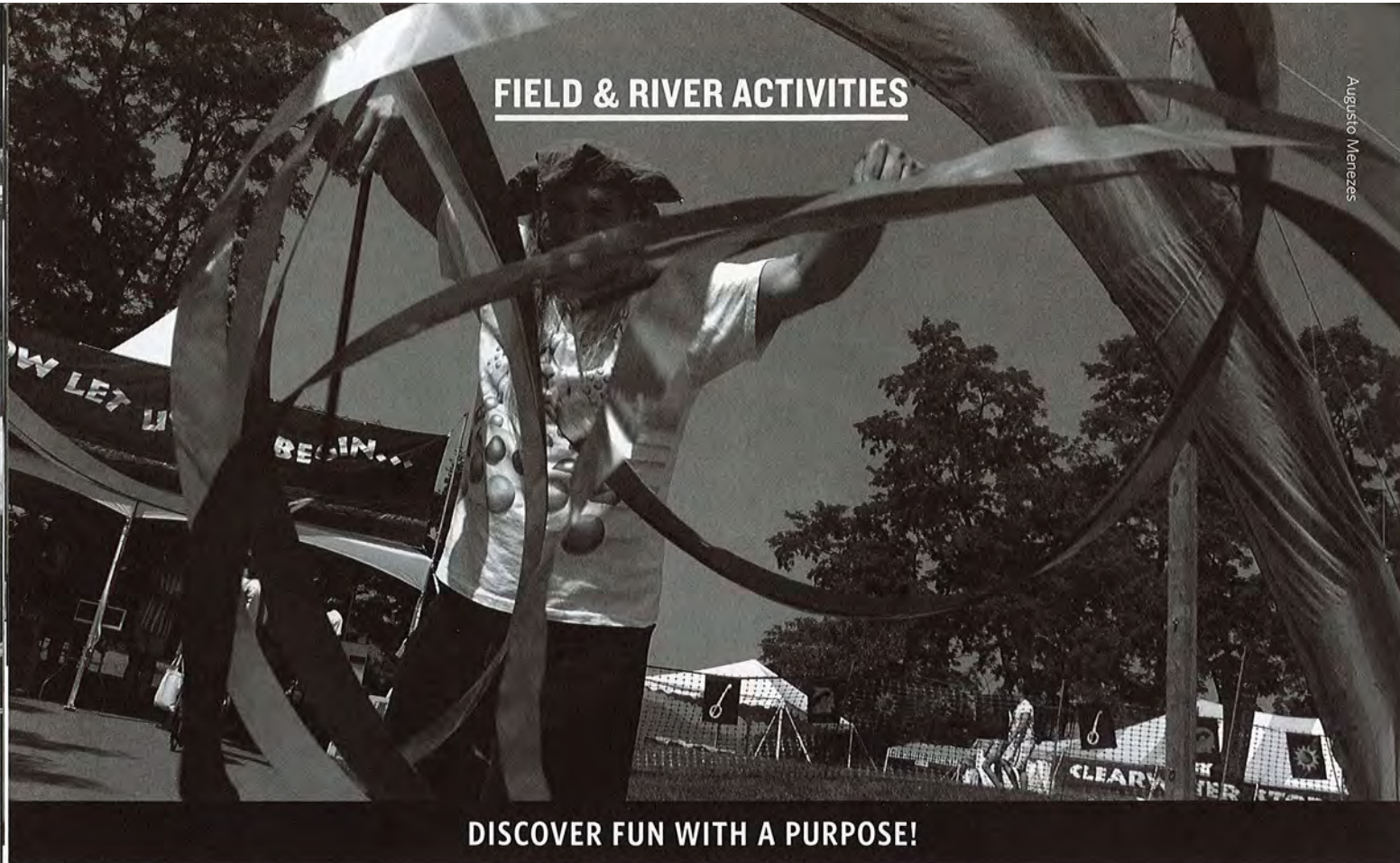

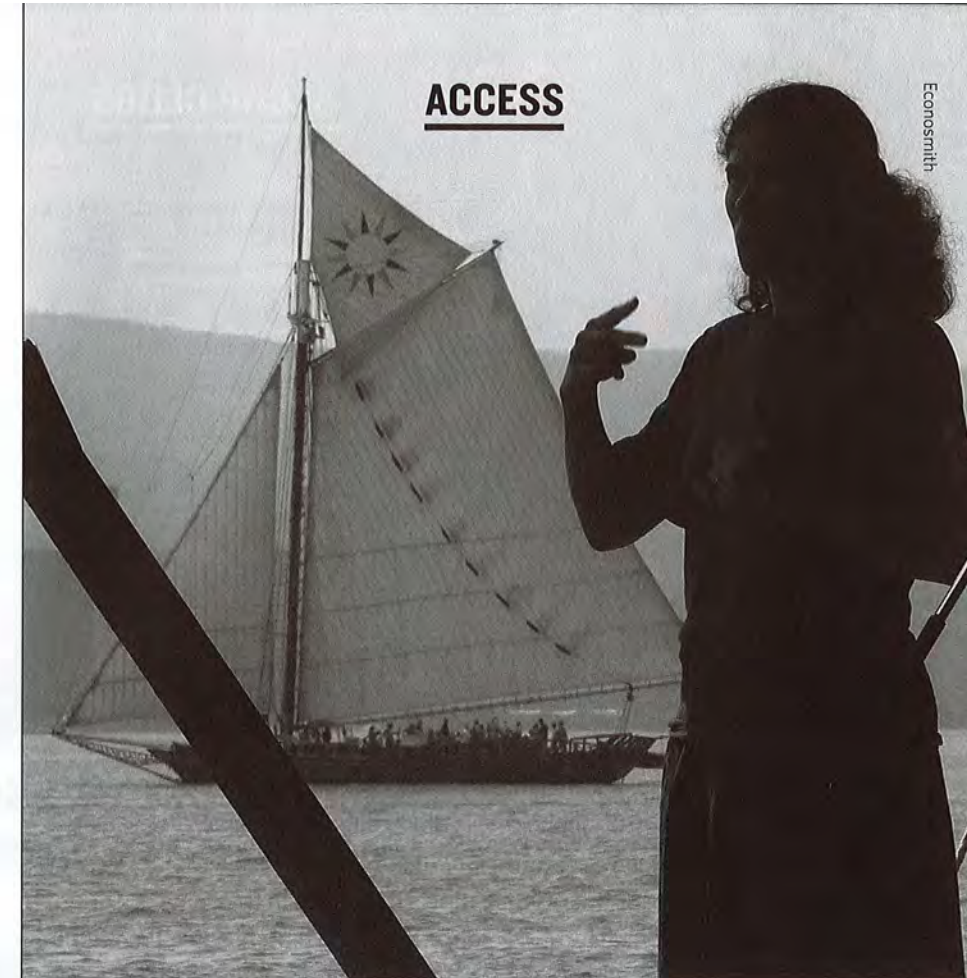

We all know that Pete Seeger has always been a champion for those who struggle with oppression. The disability community, among the most underrepresented citizens of the country, came forward early in the evolution of Revival, and Pete and Toshi Seeger made a commitment to providing equal access. As a result, the Clearwater Revival is one of the first and still one of the most accessible outdoor festival venues in the country. This accessibility is provided by establishing Access Areas at the front of all the stages; ASL Interpreters; large print and Braille programs and maps; wheelchairs to borrow free of charge; rides around the festival site, Access volunteers to assist people; and many other amenities. We pride ourselves on creating a welcoming, non-judgmental, positive attitude around all kinds of disabilities and we talk about parking, seating areas, and port-a-johns as being accessible, not as "handicapped." Words are powerful and by choosing this kind of positive language, we hope to affect change in a much broader way.

This is why there are large open areas in front of the stages that may seem to be unused during some performances. By providing this space at the front of the stages, people with disabilities and their families are welcome and don't need to move around the blankets and chairs in the audience area. We keep these areas clear and open, even when there doesn't seem to be a need, because it's much easier than asking able-bodied folks to move later. The area also provides our deaf audience members a clear view of the interpreters on stage.

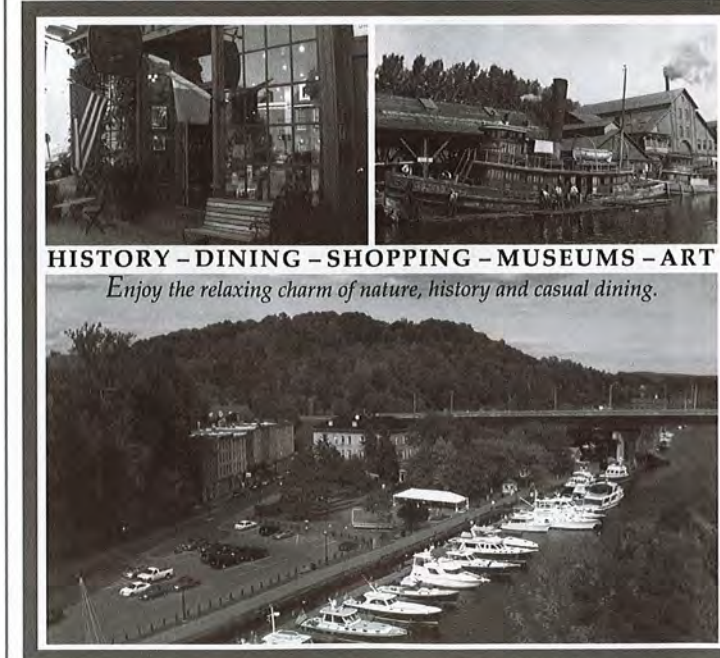

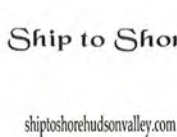

SLOOP CLEARWATER

On a cold January night in 1966, Pete Seeger typed out a wild idea to his friend Vic Schwartz, an idea that would provide a symbol for the emerging Hudson River environmental movement: "Why don't we get a few hundred families together and build a life-size Hudson River sloop?" The Hudson at that time had become little more than a waste canal. Industries and communities had been dumping anything and everything into the river since the days when sloops, those glorious vessels with enormous sails, were common on the river, carrying passengers and cargo between New York City and Albany.

On May 17, 1969, Clearwater slid down the ways of the Harvey Gamage Shipyard in South Bristol, Maine. It had been over a century since a vessel of its kind had been launched. In the 42 years since that day, over 10,000 schoolchildren per year have been introduced to the beauty that runs through their lives by participating in Clearwater's experiential sloop-based education programs; and people of all ages have been brought down to a river that had been inaccessible to them, reconnecting them to the waterway that they now care for as their own.

After 42 years of sailing and over 500,000 people who have moved across Clearwater's decks, time, wear, and tear have taken their toll. To date, her deck has been completely replaced, along with the standing rigging, sails, and the auxiliary generator, and, during the winter of 2009-

2010, we progressed to massive renovations of the hull framing and planking in the vessel's bow as part of an ambitious and proactive five-year restoration plan. The large timbers at her stern and surrounding her centerboard will follow in the upcoming years, in addition to much of the planking below the waterline—resulting in a strong new hull, ready to take on the next 40 years and the next generation of environmental leaders.

Far from being an historical remnant, Clearwater remains a dynamic and vital part of the river and its people. Almost every day during our sailing season, we welcome new students aboard and turn the Hudson River into their classroom, using the tides and currents, the fish and plankton, and the deck of our ship to get them excited about ecology, stewardship, chemistry, physics, and even math. These

students, many of whom have never been on a boat before, help us cast our net and retrieve it, work together to raise our 3,000 lb. mainsail, test the water for characteristics like salinity and pH, and, of course, get to grasp the tiller and steer the boat.

As these students grow, they are provided with many more opportunities to deepen their relationship with the river and its rich maritime history: From participating in a three- or four-day long Youth Empowerment program, to volunteering onboard for a week, to becoming a member of the crew for one to three months as a sailing apprentice, Clearwater provides a tangible way for the youth of the Hudson River to participate in the legacy of their own history.

ABOUT CLEARWATER



Hudson River Sloop Clearwater, Inc. is a 501(c)3 tax exempt nonprofit, member-supported corporation whose mission is to preserve and protect the Hudson River. In 1966, Pete Seeger was deeply concerned over the pollution of the Hudson River and announced plans to "build a boat to save the river." At the time, the Hudson was rank with raw sewage, toxic chemicals, and oil pollution, and fish populations were disappearing at an alarming rate. Seeger envisioned a majestic replica of the Dutch sloops that sailed the Hudson in the 18th and 19th centuries, thinking that such a boat would bring people down to the river to enjoy its beauty and sublime qualities, simultaneously feeling inspired to preserve it.

Inspired by that vision, the 106-foot-long sloop *Clearwater* was built and launched in 1969. The sloop was among the first vessels in the U.S. to conduct science-based environmental education aboard a sailing ship, virtually creating the template by which such programs are conducted around the world today.

Since the launch of the sloop *Clearwater*, more than half a million young people and hundreds of thousands of adults have experienced their first real look at an estuary's ecosystem—fish, invertebrates, water chemistry, and ecological principals—aboard the sloop. Clearwater's environmental education programs now serve more than 15,000 students annually, and the organization also educates over 200 teachers each year through SUNY New Paltz, Pace University, and other institutions.

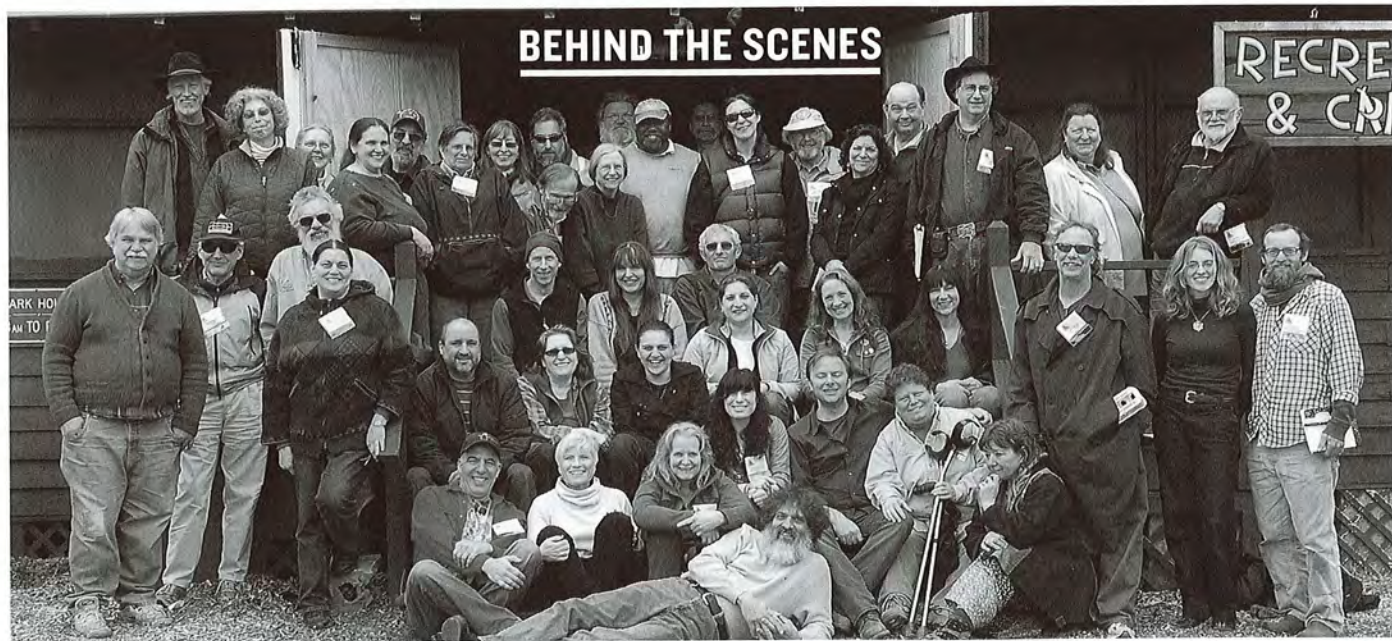
Clearwater's members have helped advocate for the Clean Water Act, the Hudson River Park Act, and removal of PCB's from the Hudson.

The sloop *Clearwater*, America's Environmental Flagship, was named to the National Register of Historic Places in 2004 for its role in the environmental movement.

Each summer, Clearwater re-connects Hudson Valley residents with their cultural heritage and traditions by bringing them down to the river for the Great Hudson River Revival, the country's oldest music and environmental festival. The organization and its local sloop clubs also sponsor smaller local riverfront festivals throughout the year. Clearwater's unique approach to public outreach has made the sloop *Clearwater* a symbol of grassroots action through hands-on learning, music, and celebration.
